NO LATEX/ACRYLIC PAINT WILL BE ACCEPTED

- ✓ Participation is limited...to ensure an appointment time please register early.
- ✓ Hadley residents are responsible for waste disposal costs at \$20 (for up to three gallons/pounds), \$30 (for quantities between 3.1 & 10 gal/lbs), or \$50 (for quantities between 10.1 & 25 gal/lbs). **Quantity is based on container size, not residual amount.**
- ✓ Motor oil, car batteries & rechargeable batteries are accepted free of charge.
- ✓ Small businesses & institutions may participate via advance arrangement only.
- ✓ Fluorescent bulbs will be accepted at \$1/bulb.
- ✓ Only cash & checks will be accepted (no credit cards).
- ✓ We encourage those with small quantities of material to partner with friends, family & neighbors to reduce traffic at the event.
- ✓ Latex/acrylic paints **WILL NOT** be accepted. Disposal information is provided on the following page.

Several days before the event, registrants will receive an assigned appointment window & paperwork to bring along with hazardous material on collection day.

DO NOT BRING

- ASBESTOS
- EMPTY CONTAINERS FROM HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS
- EXPLOSIVES (including. ammunition & fireworks)
- GAS CYLINDERS
- LATEX PAINT (see below)
- MEDICAL/INFECTIOUS WASTE
- RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL
- PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Latex Paint Disposal Instructions

Note: This process applies only to water-based latex and acrylic paint. All solvent-based paints (and their solvents) must be brought to a hazardous material collection event.

Latex and acrylic paints are problematic in their liquid form. In order to safely dispose of them in normal household trash, purchase paint hardener at an area paint or building supply store (Amherst Farmer's Supply, Cows, Lowes, Home Depot). Compile unwanted paint from partially full cans into a single paint can and stir in the powder as directed. Do not replace lid until the paint has *completely hardened* in a well-ventilated, covered area. Once hardened, you may place the paint can in the trash.

Alert your trash hauler that the paint in the can is no longer in liquid form, as paint cans are red flags for waste collection employees. If you bring fully-dried paint in cans to a transfer station, leave the lids off so attendants may verify that the paint is completely dry. Several generous scoops of kitty litter may be used as an alternative to the hardener, but the drying process will take much longer (as much as three weeks).
