Medicare Open Enrollment ends Dec. 7, 2016

There are many changes in plans, costs and coverages for 2017. Please do not disregard the mail you received from Medicare outlining these changes. You should have received a large envelope with the 'Medicare & You' inside, as well as another book from your plan that will compare the changes from 2016 to what will go into effect Jan. 1, 2017. There is at least one HNE plan that is going away entirely, so you must pick a new one or they will assign one to you. If you have questions or want assistance reviewing your plan, deciding if it still works, or need to pick a new one, call **now** for a SHINE appointment. 586-4023.




