# SECTION 8 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

#### Goal I. Protect Hadley's Agricultural Lands

- <u>Objective 1</u>. Continue to ensure town policies are farmer friendly.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Continue to use Agriculture Preservation Restrictions and other means to protect farmland.
- <u>Objective 3</u>. Promote regional recognition of Hadley's agricultural importance.

## Goal II. Protect Hadley's Public Water Supply

- <u>Objective</u> 1. Conserve/purchase land for water supply protection.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Continue water conservation strategies, including raising community awareness.
- <u>Objective 3.</u> Identify and help to mediate a solution for the perchlorate contamination issue.

#### Goal III. Preserve and Protect Historic and Scenic Landscapes

- <u>Objective 1</u>. Develop a comprehensive plan to protect historic town center and important historic resources.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Pursue official historic designations for critical areas.
- <u>Objective 3</u>. Protect historically important Great Meadows property.
- <u>Objective 4</u>. Maintain Hadley's rural character through scenic road designations and viewshed protection.
- <u>Objective 5</u>. Ensure permanent protection of conservation lands.

## Goal IV. Protect Wetlands, Wildlife Habitat and Biodiversity

- <u>Objective 1</u>. Protect undeveloped land in the riparian corridors of the Mill River, Fort River, Harts Brook, and Russellville Brook, as well as the Connecticut River.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Identify parcels to preserve along water bodies, mountain slopes, and forest habitat areas; and, pursue protection.
- <u>Objective 3</u>. Pursue more conservation restrictions on priority habitat lands.
- <u>Objective 4</u>. Make sure that permit review by all agencies recognizes sensitive resources.

## Goal V. Improve/Expand Recreational Opportunities to Hadley Residents

- <u>Objective 1</u>. Improve access to existing recreational resources and programs, especially the Connecticut River.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Identify land for potential trails, and connections between existing recreational areas.
- <u>Objective 3</u>. Improve and expand recreational opportunities for adults, families, and the Elderly, including canoe and kayak access locations.
- <u>Objective 4</u>. Plan for long-range needs for major recreational facilities.
- <u>Objective 5</u>. Continue to support collaborative solutions for the future of Lake Warner and the dam.

## Goal VI. Develop Improved Administrative Practices

- <u>Objective 1</u>. Expand staff services to Conservation Commission.
- <u>Objective 2</u>. Continue to seek out alternative/additional funding sources for land conservation and protection.
- <u>Objective 3</u>. Facilitate communication and cooperation among the town boards.
